Summary of Meetings and Activities Held/To Be Held (from Oct. 2015 through Oct. 2016):

The 7th 'Advances in Cement-Based Materials: Characterization, Processing, Modeling and Sensing' meeting was held on Northwestern campus in Evanston, Illinois (July 10-13, 2016). The meeting had 113 attendees (of which 63 were students), 78 oral presentations and 33 posters. The Cements Division currently has 237 registered members.

The Division still considers modifications to the meeting format and keeps the program, including a keynote talk by a prominent speaker opening each day of the meeting. The poster session was very well attended and vibrant conversations took place; as such the Division plans to maintain this format.

The Division had an inaugural YouTube research video contest this year and selected the winners. This was very attractive alternative to traditional forms of data dissemination and will be continued in the subsequent meetings.

Additionally, the Divisions meeting has large student participation and this year we will also select student officers to create better dialogue between the students and Division in general. Student only sessions are also considered.
