Summary of Meetings and Activities Held/To Be Held (from Oct. 2016 through Oct. 2017):

The ACerS Cements Division held their 8th Advances in Cements-Based Materials meeting June 26-28, at Georgia Institute of Technology in Atlanta, Georgia. Past division chair Tyler Ley and Kimberly Kurtis served as chairs of the conference. Highlights included a Student and Young Professional Showcase, poster session, Della Roy Lecture and a new 2 concurrent session format.

Monday's technical sessions and the Student and Young Professional Showcases were followed by an evening poster session. The session provided the opportunity for more than 20 students to present their research and to generate active discussions. This annual event encourages networking among young professionals, students and researchers.

There were 2 concurrent sessions on Durability and Novel and Sustainable Materials; the new format was successful. The Business Meeting preceding the Della Roy Lecture, encouraged meeting suggestions and comments from the attendees. Past Division Chair, Tyler Ley, provided updates on the Cements Division including ACerS supplemental funding usage, incoming division leadership and he announced the poster winners from the Monday session. This year's YouTube Research Video contest winner was Marisol Tsui Chang of Oregon State University which highlighted her poster, "Using XRF to Assess the Composition and Resistivity of Simulated Pore Solutions" inspired video entries for 2018.

The Brunauer Best Paper Award is presented to the best refereed paper on cements published during the previous calendar year in the *Bulletin* or the *Journal of the American Ceramic Society*. Paulo Monteiro, was presented the Brunauer certificate for his contribution to the 2016 winning paper: *Soft X-ray Ptychographic Imaging and Morphological Quantification of Calcium Silicate Hydrates (C–S–H) Journal of the American Ceramic Society;* (2015) authored by Sungchul Bae, Rae Taylor, David Shapiro, Peter Denes, John Joseph, Rich Celestre, Stefano Marchesini, Howard Padmore, Tolek Tyliszczak, Tony Warwick, David Kilcoyne, Pierre Levitz and Paulo J. M. Monteiro.

Paulo Monteiro of University of California, Berkeley, also presented the Della Roy Lecture, "Characterization of Cementitious Materials Using X-Ray Synchrotron Radiation: What we know, what we don't know, and what we want to know". In his lecture, he summarized the highlights and pitfalls of using this powerful characterization technique. His presentation also described new results on understanding catalytic reactions using in-situ XPS, linking the chemical and mechanical properties of calcium (alumino) silicate hydrate using HP-XRD, and characterizing the early hydration with high-resolution spectromicroscopy.

Future Planned Meetings/Activities (from Nov. 2017 – October 2018):

9th Advances in Cement Based Materials will be held June 2018 at Penn State in State College, PA. Past division chair Aleksandra Radlinska will serve as chair of the conference.
